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CURRICULUM NEWS

Mathematical Assessment Interviews (MAIs) 8th & 9th February: These two days are pupil-free days (except Kindergarten who attend on the 8th)

An important tool we use each year is the Mathematical Assessment Interview (MAI). These one-on-one interviews are an important tool we use each year, not only identifying student mathematical development, but also giving a unique opportunity to build a strong relationship between student and teacher.

Student mathematical progress is assessed in four areas: counting, place value, addition & subtraction and multiplication & division. Studies have shown that progress in these four areas indicates likely success in mathematics in future years, so identifying what each child can do and what they need to learn next, can only be of great benefit to students, teachers and parents. Crucially, identifying these things as the school year starts gives students greater opportunities to learn and move forward.

Kindergarten students are undertaking the MAI and Best Start for Literacy Assessments this week.

Written feedback will be provided to parents after the MAIs have been analysed.

Week 2 Parent Information Night 7th **February:** Our annual parent information night will be held on Wednesday, 7th February. Two classroom sessions will be run so that parents with more than one child can get to more than one class. We will also be running a whole-school interactive session in the library.

SESSION 1: 6:00 – 6:30 in classes Whole-school 6:35 – 6:55 in library SESSION 2: 7:00 – 7:30 in classes

This is an important chance to meet your child's teacher and find out about expectations and routines for the year.

Week 3 Getting to Know Your Child Interviews: We will again be conducting 10 minute "Getting to Know Your Child" interviews with each family this year (February 12-16th). These meetings are a wonderful way for class teachers to gain a better understanding of each student and give you the opportunity to talk about your child's strengths and challenges.

Parents are asked to complete the 'Getting to know your child' parent response page attached to this newsletter and return it to their class teacher by Monday, 5th February. This will give you a starting point for your meeting.

<u>Parents must book on-line to make an interview to meet your child's teacher. Please see the attached note.</u>

Thursday Assembly: We will again be conducting fortnightly 'formal' assemblies this year starting on Thursday 22nd February. At these assemblies various awards are given to children for their classroom efforts, general behaviour and attitude at school. Family and friends are most welcome to attend. Assemblies (usually) begin at 2.40pm and are conducted each fortnight.

It is <u>essential</u> that at least one parent attend this meeting which will commence at 7:30pm. Shrove Tuesday 13th February 2018



Every year we ask the Class Parents to organise and provide the pancakes for the classes on Shrove "Pancake" Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday marks the end of the Ordinary Season (for now) in the Church's calendar and is the last day before Lent. As Lent is a time of abstinence, of giving things up, Shrove Tuesday is the last chance to indulge yourself, and to use up the foods that traditionally weren't allowed during Lent. Pancakes are eaten on this day because they contain fat, butter and eggs which were

forbidden during Lent. The name Shrove comes from the old word "shrive" which means to confess. On Shrove Tuesday, in the Middle Ages, people used to confess their sins so that they were forgiven before the season of Lent began. Each child is asked to make a gold coin donation to Project Compassion on Shrove Tuesday. Class parents please liaise with teachers regarding the time and venue. We would also like to suggest that simple pancake toppings (lemon, butter, sugar, maple syrup) are preferable to extravagant and behaviour modifying toppings such as lollies and ice-cream and ask that these toppings are not made available.

Ash Wednesday 14th February 2018

We will mark the beginning of the season of Lent with our Ash Wednesday Mass to be held in the church at 9:15am. All families and friends are warmly invited to attend. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. The ashes we receive are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm



Sunday celebration of the previous year. While the ashes symbolise penance, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts.

BUS PASSES

The School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) has advised the following:

We have made some improvements to our system which now means that students who are progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to reapply if they meet the following three conditions:

are continuing at the same school

- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

The system has automatically validated a student's ongoing eligibility if they're at the same school and progressing to year 3 and year 7. Where a student met the new eligibility the system has updated their entitlement and card. If they didn't meet the new eligibility, they would have been sent an expiry notification.

If students need to update any information or reapply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails.

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2017 to ensure students' entitlements are updated and their current card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2017, the system will automatically cancel their card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for an SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during the 3rd week of January 2018.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their new travel pass at the commencement of the new school year in 2018. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students should check with their operator for more information.

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
