The new Parish Pastoral Council met last night and discussed many important issues in our Parish of Frenchs Forest.





SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM

The 2018/19 Family Based Sacramental Program is due to commence with a parent information evening on **28 June 2018.** This evening is for parents only, children do not need to attend.

This program involves preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

Confirmation will be held on Saturday 18 August at 10.00am and 12.00pm

To be eligible for enrolment in this program your child must be baptized and at least in Year 2 at school. Confirmation is the first Sacrament after Baptism in Broken Bay Diocese.

If you are considering enrolling your child, it is essential to attend this information evening. Please note the process for enrollment has changed this year and so it will be most important for you to attend the meeting to hear the instructions for the enrollment process, only parents who attend this meeting will be eligible to enrol their child in the 2018/19 Sacramental Program.
