

Frenchs Forest Catholic Parish Family Based Sacramental Program

The 2018/19 Family Based Sacramental Program will begin on **Thursday 28**th **June 2018** with an information evening to be held at 7:30pm in the Our Lady of Good Counsel Hall. All are welcome to attend. This program involves preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Eucharist. **Confirmation will be held on Saturday 18 August 2018 at 10.00am and 12.00pm.** To be eligible for enrolment in this program your child must be baptized and at least in Year 2 at school.

Confirmation is the first Sacrament after Baptism. The order of Sacraments of Initiation in Broken Bay Diocese is Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, with the Sacrament of Reconciliation taking place before Eucharist (First Holy Communion). If you are considering enrolling your child, it is essential to attend this information evening.



Please note, it will be most important for you to attend the meeting to hear the instructions for the enrolment process, only parents who attend this meeting will be eligible to enrol their child in the 2018/19 Sacramental Program.

Please note that children are not required to attend this evening. However if you are unable to attend the evening because you do not have child minding you are welcome to bring your children along. For further information please visit the parish website – www.ffcp.org.au and click on "Sacraments", and then subscribe for the current Sacramental Program 2018/19. You will then receive reminders regarding meetings and bookings.


End of Term Class Liturgies

WELLBEING CORNER

Building on from last time – Relationships are the hardest and yet the most rewarding part of families and hence the focus on relationships.

I encourage you to come along to our stay and play afternoon this Friday. All families are welcome. It will be a great way to build relationships with the children and build relationships with other parents.

PART 2 of "There are many ways to show you care even in a busy family".

Share values

Sharing common values strengthens belonging and helps families work together when challenges arise. Discuss your beliefs and values or tell stories about your own family and cultural history. Demonstrate through your behaviour values like respect, care, compassion and responsibility. Remember that children are influenced by what you do even more than by what you say.

Appreciate differences

Family togetherness doesn't mean everybody has to be the same or always do the same things. It helps to appreciate that everyone is different, and to value and respect each family member's unique needs, wants and talents. Avoiding negative comparisons, and affirming what each individual has to offer, creates strong family bonds.

Share the load

Family life can get out of balance when one person feels they have the burden of responsibilities, or when one person makes all the decisions. Supporting each other includes sharing the chores and making sure that everyone gets to have a say in the decisions that affect them.

Get support

Family life has many challenges as well as rewards. Getting support when you need it – from extended family, friends, or professionals – is important for managing the challenges. Professional counselling is a particularly valuable strategy for helping many families who experience relationship problems.
